


# Agave Fiber Crafts in Guatemala and Ecuador

Presented by Kathleen Mossman Vitale

The Sacramento Cactus and Succulent Society invites you to a special showing of film clips planned for a documentary under development. Special guest, Kathleen Mossman Vitale, co-founder and CEO of the nonprofit Endangered Threads Documentaries, will give a presentation on Agave Fiber Crafts in Guatemala and Ecuador at our January 26th meeting.

Indigenous people of the Americas have used fibers from plants in the Agave family to make utilitarian objects for many centuries, including shoes, rope, mats and carrying bags. Kathleen has filmed native people in the highlands of Guatemala and Ecuador for her study of these endangered crafts. Her travels have taken her to areas where indigenous languages predominate, and where artisans use implements passed down through the centuries.
